



All clubs, whether or not they responded in advance, are invited to participate. Just make sure you **host a** local contest by April 30 and send your winner information and \$40 check by May 3.

2024 NEBRASKA DISTRICT OPTIMIST PITCH, HIT, RUN CONTEST GUIDELINES

- 1. Lincoln's Star City Optimist Youth Foundation will host a Nebraska District PHR Contest beginning at 6:00 pm on Friday May 17, 2024, with on-site check-in and warm-up beginning at 5:15 pm at the Optimist Youth Sports Complex, 5300 South Folsom in SW Lincoln. No metal cleats are allowed.
- 2. Clubs shall host local contests no later than April 30 and sendWinner Registrations no later than May 3.
- 3. Each club will be allowed to send its local winners in four baseball and four softball division age categories (7/8, 9/10, 11/12, and 13/14) based on November 15, 2024, ages. No refunds if any fewer are sent. If a winner is not able to attend the District Competition, you may register the next highest scorer in that age bracket.
- 4. The \$40 club registration fee will be used to purchase 5 trophies in each of the eight categories plus field rentals and administration costs.
- 5. Local contests may use any competition rules they choose to select their local winners and provide local prizes of their choosing.

- 6. District winners will be registered with MLB and may advance based on District scores only if your club is not registered as a local host with MLB.
- 7. The District contest will use the more extensive MLB Competition Rules for each event so its winners are eligible to compete and earn a spot in a Team Championship (Aug.–Oct.) or National Finals (during World Series).

PITCH – each pitcher gets five (5) attempts (overhand or underhand) to hit the 17" x 30" Strike Zone target mounted 20" above the ground. Each hit is 50 points with an additional 50 points for each time the bullseye on the target is hit. Regulation baseballs will be used for baseball while 11-inch softballs (7/8 and 9/10 divisions) and 12-inch softballs (11/12 and 13/14) will be used. Baseballs will be pitched from 45 feet, while softballs will bepitched from 35 feet.

HIT – Each hitter gets five (5) tries off a batting tee; they may adjust to an appropriate height. Balls will be the same size as in pitching and hitters may use their own bats. All hits landing in "fair territory" will be measured. Distance will be converted to scores based on zones.

Distance will be converted to scores based on Zones:

Foul Zone: 0-10' – 0 Points Zone 4: 150' – 210' – 100 Points

Zone 1: 10' – 60' – 15 Points Zone 5: 210' – 270' – 150 Points

Zone 2: 60' – 90' – 25 Points Zone 6: 270' and Beyond – 200 Points

Zone 3: 90' - 150' - 50 Points

RUN – each runner gets two (2) attempts to run a 90' straight line distance from a standing position. The fastest time (to the nearest 1/10 second) will be scored using the Run Conversion Chart.

8. Scores from each of the three (3) events will be totaled. The highest score in each age bracket in each division will be the winner.





PROCEDURE:

- The hitter can adjust the tee to their desired height
- Each hitter gets 5 tries off the tee
- Only balls in fair territory count
- Each ball earns points, depending on the zone in which it lands
- There should be multiple Judges in the field near each zone line, determining any close calls and final zones where balls land and tallying scores
- All athletes not hitting should be in the dugout, or at least 20 yards from the tee at all times

SCORING:


- Every ball that lands in fair territory counts towards an athlete's overall score
- Score is based on where ball lands, not where it stops rolling
- The zones each have different points associated, as indicated below
- At the end of each player's turn, all 5 swings are totaled to give an overall number



- The Timer will call out "1-2-3 GO!" or blow a whistle to indicate when the runner should begin
- A participants time is recorded when the runner crosses the finish line. Runners DO NOT have to stop on a base
- We recommend two people keep time, one at the starting line and one at the finish line, to minimize timing mistakes
- If an athlete false starts twice in a row, the time is disqualified and it counts as one of their turns

SCORING:

- The fastest of an athlete's two attempts is what will be used for scoring
- Using the Run Conversion Chart, the Scorekeeper will find the player's fastest time and record the corresponding point value.



RUN CONVERSION CHART:

< 3.5sec add 10 pts. for every tenth of a second under 3.5sec (3.4sec = 610, 3.3sec = 620 ...)
