The Nebraska Academic Decathlon Promotes Achievement & Cooperation

With the State Finals of the Nebraska Academic Decathlon just around the corner, we should take a closer look at the person who makes it all happen, Vicki Deniston Reed. Vicki has been good enough to take on this behemoth of an annual project when the previous director, John Anstey could no longer do so. This is her third year of coordinating the Decathlon throughout the state.



Vicki's family moved to Omaha when she was in fifth grade. She ended up staying to attend UNO. Her first degree was in Criminal Justice, but she was not compelled to work in that realm, so she returned to UNO for a teaching degree. She taught at Lewis and Clark for seven years and then moved to Central High where she taught social studies, (mostly history) for 24 years. She also coached Academic Decathlon there for 18 years after earning a master's degree in history. While contemplating retirement in 2019-2020, she applied for the job of Executive Director for Nebraska Academic Decathlon. She started in that position and finished her last quarter of teaching as the Covid shutdowns were in place. She also substitute teaches in OPS.

Her hobbies include reading, cooking, and gardening. She truly loves to travel, and has been to Italy, Turkey, Bulgaria, Greece, and the Balkans, all on her own. She has also chaperoned Academic Decathlon trips here in the U.S., as well as to England, France, Belgium, the Netherlands, Germany, the Czech Republic, and Poland. One of the great opportunities for social studies teachers is being selected to participate in seminars and study tours. These have allowed her to visit China, Japan, Germany, and Turkey. She and a colleague were able to design our own study-tour of the memorialization of the Holocaust. They spent over two weeks in Central Europe at sites, museums, and conducting interviews.
