## Focus on Membeship!

The District Growth Committee is asking all clubs to have an *active* Club Membership Chair for 2019-2020. We will be contacting members, but if you want to submit a name, yours or someone else's, we would be happy to share our vision. We are looking for someone who readily invites friends, neighbors and coworkers to become part of our great organization.

Since Nebraskans are competitive by nature we thought it would be fun to have a contest. While examining our District trends, it was noted the similar numbers of members in the various zones. Based on the official numbers as of October 1, here are the challenges: Zone 2 (136) vs Zone 7 (133); Zone 4 (148) vs Zone 9 (147), Zone 6 (230) vs Zone 8 (232), then it becomes a bit tricky. Zone 1 (198) vs Zone 3 (157), so the winner of this match up will be based on % of increase at the conclusion of September 30, 2020. The final competition will be between Zone 5 -East (32) vs Zone 5 -West (46), this too may be based on % of increase.

The committee is challenging ALL clubs to finish the year with a 10% net increase. For instance if #1 Gretna (91 members) were to accomplish this goal, they would break the 100 member mark; there are other clubs also within striking distance of breaking 100. Just think of the benefits the youngsters in those communities would receive! All youngsters and all communities gain countless rewards by having an Optimist club in their community, they are the winners!

# Benefits of Participating in the Oratorical Contest

This contest is one of the better known ways that Optimists serve the youth of the world. Most everyone has at least heard of the contest. AND... we are doing it again in May 2020!

The District contest cannot happen without winners from our Zones! We cannot have Zone winners without Club winners. Will your Club host a Club level competition?

Winning participants at the District level and beyond will receive some scholarship money. The international winner will receive combined scholarships totaling up to \$22,500. The Nebraska District will award three scholarships for \$2,500, \$1,500 and \$1,000. EVERY participant will receive a boost in confidence in their ability to stand in front of 'people' and speak.

Having the confidence and skills to stand up and speak opens up several educational opportunities, fields of employment, community service, and politics. Your Club can help open all of these to Your Club's participants! And, potentially, allow them to win some scholarship money. It is so easy!

On the OI website, Optimist International has prepared a 'soup to nuts' guide for having a Club level Contest.

A few Important Things: Contestants must

- Not be a enrolled in a degree seeking program at any Post Secondary Institution
- Not be over 19 on 1 October 2020, there is no minimum age

Clubs need only 1 contestant, although having more contestants is encouraged

Contests must be complete with results submitted to the District Chair by April 3<sup>rd</sup>

\* Zone contests (if required) must be complete with the results submitted to the District Chair by 17 April 2020.
